Making the Most of your Membership: The Light at the End of the Tunnel? by Chuck Sieloff, AVAC Chair

For a community focused on reducing social isolation, the pandemic and its associated restrictions have been a major challenge. A situation initially expected to last a few weeks or months is now approaching a year in duration. Many of our normal activities had to be suspended, while others were redirected towards the use of Zoom.

While it would be foolish to suggest that everything is fine, I do believe that **the Village has responded well to the challenges it has faced**, and has demonstrated a remarkable degree of resilience and flexibility. As members grew more comfortable with Zoom and other online capabilities, we have seen a significant increase in the level of remote participation in social and educational activities and an increased use of our website. We have even been able to add some popular new benefits, like the Handyman and Tech Support services.

With the recent **approval of two effective vaccines** and more on the way, we can begin to see the light at the end of the tunnel. Many of us are understandably anxious to gain access to the vaccine as soon as possible, but the reality is that it will take some time (months, not days or weeks) for the vaccine to reach most of us. Although our demographic is statistically more vulnerable to the virus, we are also, in some ways, better able to protect ourselves through social distancing than the front-line healthcare workers, the nursing home residents, the first responders, and the essential service providers who cannot avoid public contact. Our turn will come, but the scope of this worldwide vaccine rollout is truly unprecedented and there will be unexpected bumps along the way.

On January 11th at 3:00, we will be having our Annual Meeting (on Zoom of course). This will be an opportunity to reflect in more detail about how the Village has responded to the pandemic, as well as an opportunity to start thinking about the next phase. Some things will not go back to the way they were before. For example, we will need to find ways to blend the increased access and convenience of Zoom with the social benefits of in-person activities. We will probably need to adapt to gradually reduced restrictions on things like group size and shared transportation options, rather than expecting everything to spring back to normal. I urge everyone to try to attend the Annual Meeting so we can collectively begin to explore the paths forward for our community.

The New Face of Village Marketing: Could it be Yours?

During COVID, Avenidas Village has had to come up with new ways to promote the Village and recruit new members. Our Membership and Marketing Committee has been working on a variety of new approaches including videos about the Village, linked through our website and online ads, to replace our in-person Coffee Chats. We're focusing on sharing the real experiences of our members which we believe is the best selling point for the Village! To support this, we're building a photo collection featuring our own members which can be used to create more relatable and attractive ads both online and in the local weeklies. 

February 26th Vistas: "The First 12 Steps Toward Emergency Preparedness" with Villager Bruce Heister



Concerned about how to prepare for the next disaster? PANDEM-IC, EARTHQUAKE, POWER OUTAGE, WINTER STORM OR FOREST FIRES! Learn the first twelve steps to prepare you for all of these disasters. Steps will include show 'n tell on establishing a communications plan for your family, what to keep under your bed, what goes in a "Grab and Go" kit, how to sign up for community communications, assembling emergency supply kits, and what to do with Fido and/or Tabby during an emergency.

After retiring to Palo Alto, **Bruce Heister** trained in the city's Community Emergency Response Team (CERT) program. The curriculum included disaster management, first aid, search and rescue, and light firefighting. Bruce taught search and rescue techniques in the CERT program. He learned that you need to prepare yourself and your family first, before responding to the community needs. Bruce and his spouse Ellie lived around the world where they have experienced earthquakes (Canada, Japan and California), winter storms (Switzerland, Canada, Georgia, Missouri, Ohio and California) and pandemics (Canada, Japan and California). Fortunately, they have not yet experienced a forest fire nor war.
