We're excited to welcome five new members to the Advisory Council, who will serve 2-year terms ending July 2024.



Marcie Brown joined the Village in 2020 and has recently taken over leadership of Cluster 2N. She settled in Palo Alto with her husband in 1988 after a career with Western Digital. She has ongoing involvement with many nonprofits including PTA, Junior League and is now excited to support the Village. "Things that keep me busy & happy are reading, cooking (& eating), volunteering, attending theatre events, visiting with family & friends, making connections between people, napping and laughing."

Barbara Carlitz re-joined Avenidas Village in 2020 and also serves on the Avenidas Board of Directors as Secretary & Chair of the Program Committee. # Interest Group Updates—Writers, Readers & Phone Photographers Going Strong!

Earlier this spring, three new Special Interest Groups launched. Now that they have all been active for a few months, let's check in on their progress!

**AV Writers Group** now meets as 2 separate groups to accommodate different schedules as well as in-person vs. Zoom preferences. *Group 1 leader Marita O'Reilly reports:*Writers' Group 1 began meeting on Zoom in early March. Our group encourages all types of writing: memoir, fictional pieces, poetry, essays, social commentary, family ancestry - whatever creative expression stirs our members. We have 7 active members and we meet every 2 weeks at 4PM on Zoom. We encourage our writers to send their work in advance of our meeting so others can read, think about and offer commentary or ask questions at the meeting. Each of us reads our piece aloud, or parts of it, and others may comment. We find others have ideas the writer may not have thought about. We give everyone time to participate and share. We welcome other Villagers who are interested in a consistent writing practice and a supportive community to give us a try.

Barbara Carlitz, leader of Writer's Group 2: AV Writers – Group 2 (primarily memoir writing) has been meeting in members' homes twice a month since March. The six of us write to a prompt suggested by a member, and then read our stories aloud when we meet. We have enjoyed finding similarities and differences in our past experiences and have become quite close as a group.

**Village Book Club** was designed to be a drop-in book club so that anyone can join the discussion for the monthly selection if they have read it. The group has had 3 meetings so far and has enjoyed discussing non-fiction, historical and fiction works. Village Book Club meets on the 3rd Friday each month at 11 AM on Zoom and ahead of the meeting, an email reminder goes out to all Villagers including the book to be discussed. It's a fun, friendly gathering for anyone who enjoys reading groups!

**Phone "Foto-Fun" Photography Group** began in March and alternates "teaching and photography review" sessions on Zoom with field trips to various photogenic spots in our neighborhood. We had an enthusiastic response from Villagers with minimal to moderate experience in phone camera or more traditional photography. In general, 8 to 15 participants have joined an event while others have submitted photos taken at their preferred time.

Those who participate more regularly are enjoying new friendships and acquiring phone photography skills. Bill Courington, Christine Holt, and Alice Kozar are the leaders/mentors. Zoom and photographic events often occur on alternate Mondays at 10 AM. However the schedule is varied depending on the location and time of day preferred to generate better photography... ie. bright light, soft light, golden hour early evening.

We plan to continue this model with teaching and on-site photography through the summer and into the fall. We anticipate trips to the Palo Alto Baylands, morning and evening, Allied Arts In Menlo Park with lunch at the Wisteria Café, Downtown Palo Alto, area parks, possibly Filoli, and return to other venues that we have previously enjoyed.

We are appreciating the many features embedded in the iPhone or Samsung phone camera apps, both for photography and editing, as well as editing options on iPads, laptops and desktop computers. Periodically I email easily understood articles and videos produced by the iPhone Photography Academy created by Emil Pakarklis.

Participants are encouraged to experiment, learn and above all have fun taking photos of friends, family, places they visit and sites or events they choose to remember. We share how and why we took certain photos in our group sessions and learn from each other. Bill, Chris and I offer editing suggestions and comments as appropriate, and we all enjoy the follow up. Many thanks to the participants for making this a truly fun experience! - Alice Kozar

# Trust Your Gut When Something Doesn't Seem Right: The Story of an Attempted Scam By A Village Member

Email scams are more and more common and come in many forms! One member shares their recent experience.

After recently contacting one of the vetted vendors by phone and finding the vendor to be highly qualified, a Village Member received a follow up email offering several dates for a first appointment. The ensuing emails back-and-forth seemed promising, but soon included a request for a deposit on the hourly fee, and then an advance payment for a package of sessions, before even providing the free consultation the vendor typically offers.

Even stranger, the vendor emails demanded the advance payment by Venmo (a phone payment app), and when the member refused, asked for Amazon Gift Cards as payment. "Smells Funny" (odd/unusual/strange), right?

So the Member contacted the Village, who confirmed the Member should not continue dealing with the Vendor under these terms. The Village contacted the Vendor by phone. With a little digging, the Vendor discovered that his email had been hacked. His Outlook address was being "spoofed." From the recipient Member's point of view, the hacker's email was identical to the real Vendor's email, even by hovering the cursor over the suspect "Sender."

Happy Ending: AnewVista reviewed the situation and commented that because the Member had not clicked on any links nor URLs in the spoofed messages, the Member's system was very unlikely to have been contaminated. The Vendor also followed up with the Member by phone to ensure that everything was resolved. Here are some important points to learn from this Member's experience:

- Amazon Gift Cards or other anonymous payment methods are often requested by hackers!
   Legitimate businesses will not ask for these. If you get such a request, call the person who asked you, to confirm the request really came from them.
- Pressure for advance payment by email—another red flag. If you get this type of request, call the provider before taking further action.
- Finally, trust your gut! If anything about a transaction seems off, check in with the Village office and we can help to clarify the situation before you make a mistake.

# August 26 Vistas: "Decline of Empires" with Villager Scott Pearson (rescheduled)



#### This time it's going to happen!

Drawn from a series of his essays on 12 ancient empires, Scott argues that empires first eroded internally and only later suffered external invasions. Four causes of internal erosion are illustrated -- religious excesses (Dynastic Egypt), succession crises (Roman Empire), peasant rebellions (China's Han Dynasty), and fruitless expansions (India's Mughal Empire).

Villager Scott Pearson taught economic development and international trade in the Food Research Institute. Pearson came to Stanford in 1968

and was promoted to Associate Professor with tenure in 1974 and to Professor in 1980. He served as the Food Research Institute's Associate Director (1977-1984) and Director (1992-1996). Pearson became Professor Emeritus in 2002. In retirement, Pearson has lectured on 67 travel/study programs for the Stanford Alumni Association and 121 educational travel trips in total, visiting all seven continents.
