Avenidas Village Low Income Membership Fund Drive Update

It gives me great pleasure to announce that donations to the Village's Lower Income Membership Fund totaled \$27,650 during the fourth quarter, allowing us to take full advantage of Bill Reller's generous matching fund grant of \$25,000. It is particularly gratifying that we received 65 donations representing 88 individual and household members, since that demonstrates a widespread willingness to support this important Village initiative.

Why do we need a separate fund for this? Our parent organization, Avenidas, sets the amount of our membership fees at a level that is expected to cover our fixed expenses as an Avenidas program, primarily staff salaries and an allocated share of facility overhead expenses. Other discretionary Village expenses, like the handyman and tech support benefits and the part-time social events coordinator have historically been covered by the tax-deductible donations of a relatively small number of generous members, with the money held in a "reserve fund" that the Village controls.

When we introduced the Lower Income Membership Fee as an experiment a couple of years ago, it enabled us to reduce by 50% the Village membership fees for those households whose annual incomes fall below \$60,000. the HUD threshold for "very low income" in our high costof-living area. Our goal was not to change the fundamental character of the Village, but rather to broaden its appeal within our local communities. The members and prospective members who qualify for the reduction are our friends and neighbors who, like most of us, want to age-in-place in homes and neighborhoods they have lived in for years. Those homes may have increased greatly in value, but for those living on a relatively fixed income, the reduced membership fee makes the Village a more affordable option for helping them achieve their goal of aging-in-place. But each reduced membership



fee creates a 50% shortfall in the calculation that Avenidas uses to set our basic membership fee, so the Village needs to compensate for that shortfall by transferring additional funds to Avenidas. Those funds come from our Lower Income Membership Fund, which now, for the first time, has enough money held in reserve to ensure the longer-term financial viability of the program for the next couple years.

This is a significant achievement for the Village, and gives us the confidence to publicize its availability more widely through existing Avenidas communications channels and through word-of-mouth from our members. If you have friends or neighbors who might benefit from the reduced membership fee, please let them know about its availability and encourage them to contact Erika Thomas for additional information.
